
#### **VBS Decorating Prep**

#### **CO-PASTOR CORNER**

In a recent Christianity Today article, Russell Moore, recounted how at his wedding 30 years ago, he insisted that Ruth 1:16 not be one of the scriptures read in the wedding ceremony. That's the famous verse read at so many wedding across the years. ""Whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God" (KJV)

After 30 years of a wonderful marriage, that's the one thing, Moore says, that he would change. At the time he didn't think it was a text strictly about marriage. But now he thinks that text would have been the best predictor of what their married life would be - a commitment to walk together into a future completely unknown when the marriage vows were made.

Moore reflects, "What I really would not have predicted, though, is how—just like the story of Ruth—so much of our story would be made up not in those "big" moments but in the very small, ordinary ones."

Moore continues, "Last night, Maria and I walked with our youngest son down to the creek by our house, where our son climbed some trees as we walked the dog. The cicadas were buzzing and the fireflies were flashing all around. I stopped and wanted to freeze that moment in time. It was almost as if a future version of myself was time traveling back to whisper, "This is the best". This is the sort of thing you will remember on your deathbed. Those are the moments that shape a life, that surprise us with joy."

We have a tendency to focus on the big dramatic moments of our lives, turning points, and weighty decisions, as the most significant. But in truth, it may be the daily providence of God's grace guiding us in the midst of all our ordinary moments that is the way we are being "conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters." (Rom. 8:29) Brief moments when by God's grace we say the right word, stop and notice the beautiful, reach out to help someone who is hurting, open and yield ourselves to God's spirit.

We live in a time when every bit of news, every advertisement, every election, every current event insists that it is the most important thing in the world right now. Of course there are matters of real and important consequence happening at different times and different places. But faith has its deepest roots in the ways God is at work in life's simplest moments where even our

breathing in and breathing out is filled with the Holy Spirit's desire to fill us with Christ's love.

As we move from Pentecost into ordinary time, as we consider the ways the Spirit is moving in the life of Park Lake Presbyterian Church, as we enjoy summer days filled with the wonder of creation's growth and abundance, it is an especially good time to seek to be open to the everyday moments of life that "surprise us with joy." The little reminders that God created us to enjoy God's glory, to bask in and reflect the warmth and life of God's love.


