CO-PASTOR'S CORNER

Park Lake's 100th Anniversary will occur a year from now in October 2025. This month we begin to anticipate and celebrate that important milestone. We are also beginning our 2025 Stewardship Campaign this month. The theme of the Stewardship Campaign is "Our Generous Future."

When the anniversary of a church and stewardship overlap there are all sorts of ways to ponder how they are related. Starting a church is, in and of itself, an act of stewardship. It requires great commitment of time and resources from many individuals. It is an act of faith, a response of people to what they believe God is calling them to do. When you are celebrating a church's anniversary you become keenly aware of the ways countless individuals have been good stewards of the church God has entrusted to them over the years. You realize that you are a recipient of other's generous stewardship.

As I begin to think about Park Lake's 100 years, I keep coming back to the question, "why start a church?" It might actually be easier to answer how to start a church. There are a host of factors in the why question: Who was involved? What was happening that made them think starting a church was the right thing to do? Who supported it? Who was in charge? What else was happening in the community that impacted the decision?

As you seek to understand all the factors involved in the decision to start a church you get a sense of the central role faith must have played in the lives of those who undertook such a big task. It wasn't strictly what we might call a business decision. Nor was it based solely on demographics or social trends. It wasn't the result of any one individual's talents and abilities. It was the work of the faith of many people inspired and guided by the Holy Spirit. When Park Lake held its first worship service, Sunday, October 11, 1925 there certainly would have been some sense of "look at what we've done", but an even greater sense of "look at what God has done."

Park Lake was started by the desire and decision of First Presbyterian Church of Orlando to expand it's ministry and program. Clearly they were responding to Orlando's growth, a sense of the community's religious and spiritual needs, and the economic vitality of the day. But by starting a new church, they were also being the church, as they acted with enthusiastic obedience to God's Word and followed the direction of the Holy Spirit. They responded to God's call to engage in God's work in the world - the reconciliation of the world to God in Jesus Christ.

Stewardship was at the heart of what First Presbyterian Church was doing when it started Park Lake in 1925. Stewardship is at the heart of what we are doing as we celebrate Park Lake's 100th anniversary and we enthusiastically say yes to the work God sets before us at Park Lake today and in the next 100 years. We have a "generous future" grounded in God's great generosity to us yesterday, today, and tomorrow.



(PATH). The offering is collected on the 1st Sunday of each month on Communion Sundays, as a reminder that as we have been fed at the Lord's table we are called to feed others.



Let Justice Roll Down: God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All CreationBy Patricia K. Tull

We are called to care for neighbors and God's creation with all our hearts, with particular care for society's least powerful members who are disproportionately impacted by unjust systems. In God's first instructions to the nation of Israel we hear "you shall not pervert the justice due to the poor" (Exodus 23:6); in Moses' final speech at the promised land's border, he reiterated, "Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue" (Deuteronomy 16:20); and from Amos, the earliest recorded prophet, "Let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever flowing stream" (Amos 5:24). Scripture reminds us that we are called to speak out to urge our society to act for just transitions in this fast-changing world.

October - Missions and Missionaries



The Park Lake church library has a Missions section 266 which is on the bookcase on the west wall, second shelf down.

<u>From Jerusalem to Irian Jaya</u>, by Ruth A. Tucker. It is a biographical history of Christian Missions published in 1985. I wish we had a similar book for the last 40 years. Here are some chapter titles of interest: "The Early Centuries Evangelizing the Roman Empire"; "American Indian Missions: Seeking the Nobel Savage"; "Black Africa: The White Man's Graveyard"; and "New Methods and Strategy: Reaching Tomorrow's World". The postscript gives an opinion on the failures and successes of Christian Missionary work.

In section 268 is <u>Before You Pack Your Bag: Prepare Your Heart Short—Term Mission Preparation Guide with 12 Bible Studies plus Trip Journal</u>, by Cindy Judge. On page 13 it reads, "It is very important to learn early that the social behaviors of another culture are not necessarily wrong; they are just different from yours... It's not wrong; it's just different.
