CO-PASTORS CORNER

For many years, one of my favorite professors in seminary, John H. Leith, would send out a Christmas letter to former students. I looked forward to getting Dr. Leith's Christmas letter, because he had the ability to articulate the Christian faith with clarity and precision. His Christmas letters were always a helpful reminder of the meaning of Christmas and its importance to our faith. Plus, they were filled with Dr. Leith's characteristic irascible opinions, which made an interesting contrast to his Christmas cheer. Dr. Leith died in 2002, and I've missed his Christmas letters. But each year since, I review one the ones I've filed away, and decided to share a few quotes with you.

I can remember at least 70 Christmases. My earliest memories include my mother hanging a picture of Jesus and a picture of Santa Claus in our home, decorating the Christmas tree and hanging the stockings, and the Christmas play at the church...In good years and bad, Christmas has always meant wonder, awe, joy and human happiness. Singing the Christmas carols has without exception been a powerful means of grace. Can we not limit "Advent" to one Sunday? (Christmas 1993)

Christmas means that the created world is good. In the birth of Jesus, creation became the habitation of the Creator Himself. Let us rejoice and be glad in it. Joy and human exuberance is as much a part of the Christian life as soberness and sorrow. At Christmas time we greet each other in a friendly way; we send Christmas cards; we give gifts to those who are near and dear to us; we are compassionate and help those in need. All this is the wonder of Christmas. (Christmas 2001)

Last Christmas, I wrote that the really great question facing human beings is death and the end of history. I know this on a personal level now even better than a year ago. The problem of guilt does not arise until we have some word to speak over against death and the end of history, over against the fragileness and certain doom, not only of human persons but also of institutions and communities, over against the terrible aloneness in a world without a God who knows us by name.

Christmas means that God is personal and personally active in the created order of nature and history. Augustine said, "We worship not the sun, but the Son of righteousness who created the sun". Christmas means that the God who created the world has become embodied, in so far as God can become embodied, in a human life in Jesus of Nazareth. We therefore call him the Son of God. God did personally enter our human condition, was crucified and buried. The climas of our faith is the affirmation that Jesus of Nazareth was raised from the dead by God. We proclaim this gospel of a God who is active in human history and who is more powerful than death. (Christmas 2000)

Christmas Eve has always been an awesome time for me, especially as I remember my experiences as a boy. Now in old age, we experience the awesomeness of what happened in the birth as well as the mystery and wonder of human existence itself....Many of you have heard me say that I would never send out a Christmas card unless I could address it. I take that back this year, as my hands are in such a situation that I cannot address many letters. I shall, however sign my name. Have a merry and blessed Christmas and the best New Year ever! (Christmas 2001)

It would have added a 3rd tower to the sanctuary building next to a new west transept, and changed the look of the other two towers. The transepts were built, but not the 3rd tower.


