



CO-PASTOR CORNER

Listening to Jesus in Lent

My Dad got a reel-to-reel tape recorder when my siblings and I were young. The idea was the family would record messages to my grandparents and send them the tape by mail since that was cheaper than long-distance phone calls. But Dad found all kinds of other uses for the tape recorder.

One evening he secretly taped our dinner conversation. Dinner was always a talkative time. My sister was about 4 years old. When we played back the conversation it sounded like everybody was talking at once. But in all the commotion you could hear my little sister's voice saying over and over again, "Honk, honk. Beep, beep." Nobody was listening to her and it was the only way she could think to be heard in all the family noise.

I was reminded of that as I read the story of Jesus' transfiguration. It was a scene of sensory and spiritual overload for Peter, James, and John, the three disciples Jesus took with him. Bright white light, the appearance of Moses and Elijah with Jesus, a cloud enveloping them on the mountain. As they were leaving Peter started talking. Luke adds parenthetically, he didn't know what he was saying. But that didn't stop him from talking. A voice came from the cloud and said, "This is my Son, my Chosen, listen to him."

Listen to Jesus. You can't ask for a clearer instruction than that. But how often is our first reaction to so many things in life to just start talking, like Peter, without knowing what we are saying? Life seems to be filled with so much constant talking, 24/7, that we simply become numb and lose the capacity to listen. Even though technology has made talking unlimited, we increasingly describe ourselves as isolated, divided, anxious, worried, and depressed. Obviously, talking and listening don't always go together.

Listen or hear is a word Luke uses frequently in his gospel. Its use ranges from the simple description of one person hearing another, to the moments when listening or hearing marks a turning point in life. At the end of Luke's Christmas story we learn that "the shepherds returned glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen." When the shepherds heard the angels their lives were changed. When Jesus visited the house of Mary and Martha, Mary sat at Jesus' feet listening to what he said. It frustrated Martha for Mary to sit and listen while she did all the work. But Jesus said, Mary chose the better thing, to listen to Jesus. When have we chosen to listen to Jesus, even if it means putting our to-do lists on hold?

This Lent we are going to try to listen to Jesus. We will explore places in Luke's gospel where we're reminded how listening is a fundamental part of being Jesus' disciples. We will consider the obstacles in our lives to listening to Jesus. What makes listening to Jesus so hard? How do we hear Jesus today? On Wednesday evenings we will try to listen to Jesus by listening to each other. If Jesus is present with us in and through the life of our church and its members, how can we listen to each other in a way that helps us to hear Jesus in one another?



Jesus concluded the parable of the Sower this way, "Let anyone with ears to hear, listen!" I think Jesus means us. I pray this Lent we can learn to listen to Jesus as a way of following him as his disciples.

The following article was published in The Orlando Sentinel, Thursday, December 21, 1933.

An unusual pageant will be put on in the Park Lake Presbyterian church, corner of Highland and Colonial Dr., Sunday afternoon, December 24 at 5 o'clock. It is based on a medieval Christmas story and was written by Dr. Hugh T. Kerr, pastor for many years of the Shadyside Presbyterian church of Pittsburgh, PA. Miss Bessie Miner and Mrs. Belle B. Clokey are directing the pageant, assisted by a committee from Mrs. T.P. Hanna's Bible class. Music, dialogues, decorations, lighting and costumes will all be very effective. The Park Lake Presbyterian Women Circles have been studying the 2024-2025 Bible Study "Let Justice Roll Down: God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation", By Patricia K. Tull.

Esther Circle has been enjoying the PW study this year. In February, climate change was discussed, and the Esther Circle wanted to share this one aid that we found helpful in the Study Guide.

Ayana Elizabeth Johnson, a marine biologist and policy expert, has staked her life in working for climate action. She quotes Presbyterian minister and theologian, Frederick Buechner's famous saying, "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

Ms. Johnson says what we can each do most energetically and persistently lies at the intersection of three circles in a Venn diagram. The circles being: "What work needs doing?" "What are you good at?" and "What brings you joy?"

The three questions together offer direction: What are we prepared to do that needs doing? That, she says, "is what the moment asks of each of us."

White Gift Sunday dates back to 1904 in Ohio. The wife of a Methodist minister and her two daughters came up with the idea of giving gifts wrapped in white paper at Christmas time to people in need.

Gifts are wrapped in white so that they will be anonymous. People who can only give a little will not be embarrassed. There is a also a Chinese tradition where all the people gave their king a gift wrapped in plain white paper so that every gift would look the same. People gave the king what they were able, and the king welcomed them all.

The White Gift shares in the spirit of Christ and the God of love at Christmas. We give gifts of love to people in need. These gifts are often nonperishable food items that are distributed to people in the community.

White Gift Sunday celebrates the stewardship of God's love and giving at the time of year when we remember the coming of the King of Kings.
