Bible Story

The Widow's Offering (Mark 12:41-44)

Today, children were invited to consider how God's power can help them share and give. We learned about how Jesus taught others about this through the story of a widow who gave all she had for God. Though the widow's offering of two copper coins seemed small to observers, Jesus explained that it was actually a very large sacrifice because it was all she had to live on. As they experience this act of giving through Jesus' words, children will be inspired to draw on God's strength to give what they have for God's kingdom. Just like the widow gave what she had through faithful strength in God, children can accept the invitation to seek God's strength to give what they have for God's kingdom throughout their lives.
